Here are some things you need to know and do.

Before you visit

Advise a committee member of your intention to visit, contact the camp host or send an email to us at "veteransretreats.wa.inc@gmail.com" Advise us of the date you intend to arrive, duration of your stay and the number of persons.

Camping Fee's

Please pay camping fees to the camp host, and Fill in the visitors register on arrival.

Accommodation

There is a large area inside the electric cattle fence. You can set up a camp anywhere inside the fence but ask the camp host first. Your choice may not be the best choice for a variety of reasons.

We have Donga's available for those without any camping equipment but the Donga's will cost more.

Clubhouse

The clubhouse is available to all, and is a place to socialise and relax. We have a communications tower and mobile telephone is available in a short range from the clubhouse. Sometimes reception is good enough for internet but we are in a fringe area so do not rely on it. Only Telstra Next G works from this tower.

Rubbish

There are NO rubbish Facilities at the retreat. All rubbish is to be disposed of appropriately off Meentheena. Cleanup your camping area.

Toilet Waste

Black water needs to be contained and removed from Meentheena. There is a disposal point in Marble Bar

For Your Safety

When leaving the campsite please advise the Camp Host of your intended route. He knows the area well, and can advise you of road conditions. If it is possible please have a Satellite phone or a HF radio. Keep in touch with friends/family at home.

Water

Water at the retreat is from a bore and is considered drinkable but like all water in the north west does have some sediment.

Checking Out

Check out in the visitors book on your departure. Let the camp host know your next destination. It is essential. In the case of emergency we can refer to this book.

Caring for Meentheena

As the area is a proposed Conservation Park, members and visitors are to comply with the following rules.

- 1. Firearms are not permitted**
- 2. All wildlife is protected**
- 3. No collection of firewood is permitted.**
- 4. No excavation or damage to or removal of plants, dead or alive is permitted**
