A Story from 1932.

COUNTRY STYLE 4 HOOF RIDE OF 1000 KMS!

A 9-year-old boy, Lennie Gwyther was the son of a World War 1 hero, Leo Tennyson Gwyther. Leo had chronic war injuries and had broken his leg on their farm in South Leongatha which is in south-eastern Victoria. While Leo was in hospital, Lennie completed the ploughing and saved the crops. Leo was very grateful, so he asked his son how he could reward him. Lennie had read about the Sydney Harbour Bridge. He really wanted to see it and be on the spot for it's opening. With his parents' approval, he set off on an epic journey of 1000kms to Sydney, riding his pony, Ginger Mick. Lennie had planned his route, stopping at towns such as Lakes Entrance, Cooma and Bowral. He followed bush tracks and barely formed dirt roads east to Cann River, then north to Canberra. The courageous pair survived a deranged tramp jumping out at them a few days into their ride, a bushfire near Traralgon, heavy rain and fogs.

Canberra was a very new town where sheep grazed in front of (now the Old) Parliament House. Lennie shook Prime Minister Joseph Lyons' hand and had tea in the members' refreshment rooms, while Ginger Mick shared grass with the sheep.

When the pair arrived in Sydney's Martin Place, they were mobbed by the public and the press. Lennie met the lord mayor of Sydney at the Town Hall, visited Circular Quay, Bondi Beach and rode an elephant at Taronga Zoo.

On March 19, 1932, Lennie and Ginger Mick took part in the Sydney Harbour Bridge opening pageant, crossing the bridge among indigenous groups, war veterans, school children and bridge workers. He saluted the Governor General and the NSW premier.

On March 21, at a match at the Sydney Cricket Ground, Lennie met Donald Bradman, who gave him a signed cricket bat.

Lennie rode Ginger Mick home arriving on June 10, where a huge crowd turned out in the main street of Leongatha.

It was an amazing feat for a young boy and his pony!

Ginger Mick lived to the age of 27 years on the Gwyther farm. Lennie married, had a daughter, and settled in Melbourne. He worked as an experimental engineer at General Motors' Holden plant at Fisherman's Bend. He was a keen fisherman, astronomer, ice skater and sailor. At the time of his death aged 70 in 1992, he was building a yacht which he planned to sail to Tasmania and New Zealand.
